EMERGING TRENDS IN CHAMPAGNE

Wine Lister recently asked its Founding Members (c.50 key fine wine trade players from across the globe) to vote on the most important current trends in Champagne. Here we look at the five foremost trends, selecting a wine that exemplifies each one.



Whether from a single vineyard, like Clos des Goisses, or made from biodynamic grapes, like Cristal, the five are very evenly matched in terms of Quality, all achieving outstanding scores. Dom Pérignon's P2, with its extra bottle age, comes joint first.

LONG-TERM PRICE PERFORMANCE

Selosse Substance +13.0% Long-term price performance Krug Brut Grande Cuvée +9.5% allows us to visualise the impact of these trends. In Dom Pérignon P2 +9.4% contrast to the search ranks, Selosse Substance tops the Clos des Goisses +8.0% table, the grower Champagne recording three-year CAGR of 13.0%. Cristal +5.9%

Search rank results, obtained using the average number of searches on Wine-Searcher. confirm that the established houses continue to dominate in terms of popularity, Cristal being the 14th most popular wine on Wine Lister, and Krug's Grande Cuvée, with its "Krug ID" numbers on each bottle.
